Jesus Heals 10 Lepers

Memory Work:

*"Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed."
James 5:16a NRSV*

*"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you."
Matthew 7:7 NIV*

Jesus said to go, and these lepers just went. They trusted Jesus. They acted on Jesus' words. Their healing took place in their trust and obedience. Full healing involves worship with a thankful praising heart. The 10th leper had that kind of a heart. He showed thankfulness and praise. God built into us a need for a day of rest. Worship is that day of rest - using thanks and praise. When we sing or say the kyrie during worship: "Lord have mercy. Christ have mercy." We're standing with the lepers along the road. We're saying to God - We need your healing touch - listen to us.
